How to qualify for CAMP?

The College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) is a national educational equity program funded by the U.S. Department of Education, Office of Migrant Education. Bakersfield-CAMP is designed to assist its first-time freshmen students during their first-year in college, to successfully complete their freshmen year at CSU, Bakersfield. High school students interested in participating in Bakersfield-CAMP are assisted with the completion of their college admission process and the overwhelming transition into college.

Has at least one immediate family member who has spent a minimum of 75 days during the past 24 months in seasonal farmwork*

- ✓ Meet CSUB's admission requirements
- ✓ Provide proof of U.S. Citizenship or Residency
- ✓ Must qualify to receive Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

**Farmwork may include any seasonal activity directly related to the production of crops, dairy products, poultry, livestock, the cultivation or harvesting of trees, or fish farms. It includes work performed for either wages or personal subsistence on a farm, ranch, nursery, packing or similar establishments.*
